Improving Undergraduate STEM Education: Education and Human Resources **Deadline:** December 4, 2019

Award: \$300,000 - \$600,000 (over three years)

The IUSE: Education and Human Resources (IUSE: EHR) program promotes novel, creative, and transformative approaches to generating and using new knowledge about STEM teaching and learning to improve STEM education for undergraduates. The program supports development, implementation, and research efforts that: (1) bring recent advances in STEM disciplinary and interdisciplinary knowledge into undergraduate education, (2) adapt, improve, and incorporate evidence-based practices into STEM teaching and learning, and (3) lay the groundwork for institutional improvement.
