Recent Awards

- Congratulations to the Child Development Center for another round of funding from the Childcare Restoration Grants Program (a part of the Illinois Business Interruption Grants [BIG] program). The \$67,637 award will cover COVID-19-related expenses from January, February, and March of 2021.
- Triton recently received \$562,944 from the Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund II (HEERF II), which was established under the Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act (CRRSAA). Triton qualified for this funding as a minority-serving institution (MSI). As such, the award is intended to cover costs related to the COVID-19 pandemic and that support minority students. Deadline: Ongoing Award: \$250-\$100,000 or higher

Two of the Omron Foundation's priority areas are STEM education and support for individuals with disabilities. Funded STEM projects at institutions of higher education have focused on engineering technology (especially robotics and mechatronics), automation, and electrical engineering. The Foundation also supports organizations and projects that prepare individuals with disabilities for the workforce.

Verizon Foundation

Deadline: Rolling Award: \$5,000-\$10,000

The Verizon Foundation funds projects that promote STEM education, such as summer or after school programs, teacher training, and research on improving STEM learning through the use of technology. At least 85 percent of a grant award must go toward direct costs, and IT infrastructure-related purchases, such as computer hardware, software, data or networks, should total no more than 20 percent of a grant's total direct costs.
